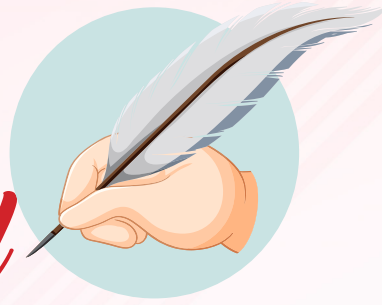

Model United Nations (NPS MUN)

Mun is a platform where a student can build his/her confidence, learn researching and diplomatic relations. It builds the skill of cooperation and coordination. NPS Mun chapter-8 was conducted on 18th-19th of Jestha, under supervision of secretary General Angel Ghorasaini and under secretary General Ishan Dev Karki. The program was a great success with around 120 participants as delegates and 18 dais members. Five committee in total was smoothly conducted among them. The first committee was food and Agriculture organization (FAO), which included two agendas in total; Agenda A was empowering youth in inclusive and sustainable food security and Agenda B was Reduction of factory farming. With impressive participation and dedication of dais members Rohan Singh, Amitav Mahato, Aman Babu Ram and Viver Chaurasiya with total delegates 28, the students who had shown their best performance as delegates 28, and the students who had shown their best performance as delegates were Shivam Sah and Mansi Das, the Best speaker was Resis Sanjel and active participant was Lokesh Yadav.

Second Committee was economic and financial affairs council configuration (ECOFIN) which had disaster reduction as Agenda A and global efforts to combat Desertification as Agenda B with dais Aayam luitel, Sushant Singh, Dewa Das and Manish Kumar Yadav with total delegates 28.
